Continuing preparing or planning your allotment.

- 2. Cut back fruit bushes or plant new ones.
- 3. Weed & prepare beds
- Sow seeds, broad beans, swiss chard, carrots peas, radish. Under cover you can sow aubergines, tomato, peppers & chillies
- 5. Plant early variety of potatoes

LEEK, BACON, KALE & BRUSSELS SPROUT HASH



Ingredients Eggs Leeks 10-15 Brussels sprouts thinly sliced 5-6 Kale leaves, stem removed thinly sliced 4 Bacon slices 1 cup of Potatoes diced 1 Lemon 2 tablespoons of Olive oil

Instructions

Prep all vegetables slicing and dicing.

Fill saucepan with water and bring to boil add eggs pre poach to make it a little easier.

Cook bacon in large skillet over medium heat until crispy, remove from pan, turn heat down too low to let pan cool slightly for 2 mins.

Add olive oil to pan, followed by leeks and potatoes, stirring them so they are mixed and coated with oil. Stirring to avoid burning, cook until leeks and potatoes are soft.

Add Brussel sprout slices, cook for additional 5 mins. During this time chop bacon into small pieces.

Add kale and bacon, cook until Kale is just starting to wilt and remove pan from heat. Add a few squeezes of lemon juice and salt and pepper to taste, top with poached eggs and enjoy!

WILDLIFE AREA.

We were delighted to learn last autumn, that we have been given the ROYAL HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY'S

OUTSTANDING award for our Wildlife Area in 2023. This is the highest level achievable in the Your Neighbourhood London in Bloom judging. The Wildlife Area belongs to all of us, you can walk around it anytime you like, and it is only so good because plotholders volunteer to take part in occasional short, enjoyable work parties to maintain it



To increase the diversity of environments we provide, blue tit/great tit nest boxes have just been installed in the hazel hedge, and communal house sparrow nest boxes have been placed in the pyracantha bushes.





On the grass verge alongside the main allotment road, opposite the front pond on the Wildlife Area, there is a lovely spreading patch of Spring Cyclamen. It is flowering now, and well worth a view.



The hazel hedge was planted 11 years ago, using 12 inch high saplings. It is now 13 feet high and dense enough that we hope birds will feel that it provides adequate shelter.
